

This is a grassroots event, facilitated and organised by our fabulous volunteer Landcare members for our members.



A PROGRAM FOR SCHOOLS

Cane toads are incredibly toxic to the animals they come into contact with. Toad Talks is a program that teaches students how to distinguish cane toads from native frogs, what to do when they come across a cane toad and how the community can help prevent their spread further south.

Toad Talks can be presented to your students in their classrooms or the school hall if larger groups are preferred.



Next round of Habitat Action Grants open

Minister for Agriculture and Western NSW - Media Release

5 Aug 2022

Applications are officially open for the next round of the <u>Habitat Action Grants</u> to help improve fish habitat and opportunities for recreational fishing.

Minister for Agriculture and Western NSW Dugald Saunders said up to \$850,000 is available for various projects, including managing stock access to waterways, revegetating native plants, reintroducing large woody habitat and bank stabilisation works. "This is a fantastic opportunity for recreational fishers, community groups, councils, private landholders and natural resource managers, who know their local waterways better than anyone, to apply for funding to improve local fish habitats," Mr Saunders said.

"Every year we receive truly unique applications and the best thing about these grants is they are ideas conceived and led by locals, both on the coast and inland. "Even better is that fishos will be able to see their fishing licence fees being put to good use because this is their money being reinvested into projects in their area." Habitat Action Grants are funded from the Recreational Fishing Trusts, where all funds raised by the NSW Recreational Fishing Fee are placed.

Thirty-three projects were funded under the 2021/22 round of grants with a total of \$780,191 awarded to recreational fishing groups, land managers and local councils from Coffs Harbour to Goulburn.


Since 2008, the Recreational Fishing Trusts have invested more than \$8 million into the Habitat Action Grants program throughout NSW. 2022/23 applications are open until 23 September 2022.

The Purves Environmental Fund enables and empowers others to work together to achieve meaningful impact in the areas of environmental sustainability and biodiversity.

Focus areas for funding are:

- Habitat destruction
- Capacity building of key NGOs
- Climate change adaption

All interested applicants must complete an Expression of Interest (EOI) prior to proceeding to an application. EOIs must be submitted online. Applications are open throughout the year.

It is generally recommend to seek funding of below \$50K for new applicants, however there are no strict guidelines to this.

This year our annual Community Grants Round offers support to community organisations with a range of grants from \$10,000 to \$50,000.



Applications are open 1st to 31st August 2022.

In response to critical issues impacting the Northern Rivers community, this year's Community Grants Program will offer the following streams of funding:

- 1. Small Grants of up to \$10,000 funding four priority areas of Recovery & Resilience, Disadvantage, Environment and Housing & Homelessness.
- 2. Recovery and Resilience Capacity Building Grants of up to \$25,000 to support disaster recovery initiatives, resilience and disaster mitigation projects.
- 3. Flood Relief Fund Capacity Building Grants of up to \$50,000 to support Feb/ March 2022 flood recovery initiatives, resilience and disaster mitigation projects.

Strengthening Rural Communities

The Strengthening Rural Communities (SRC) program aims to give the thousands of small remote, rural and regional communities across Australia an opportunity to access funding to support broad community needs.

Three funding streams are available:

- 1. **Rebuilding Regional Communities (RRC):** grants up to \$10,000 to respond to ongoing impacts and recovery from the COVID pandemic;
- 2. Bushfire Recovery: grants up to \$25,000 for 2019/20 bushfire recovery;
- 3. **Small & Vital:** grants up to \$10,000 for broad initiatives that strengthen local people, places, and climate solutions with a preference for smaller communities (populations under 15,000).

Grants are available for a broad range of grassroots, community-led initiatives that directly and clearly benefit local communities. Applications are accepted on an ongoing basis and assessed quarterly.
