Mission Statement

Our social, cultural and environmental mission is to promote sustainable land, agricultural, water, vegetation, and biodiversity management practices and principles to the wider community to develop their capacity to manage the local natural resources.

About Us

Clarence Landcare Incorporated (CLInc.) is a not-for-profit community organisation operating in the mid-lower Clarence Catchment located in the NSW North Coast Region (roughly aligned with Clarence Valley Council geographical area).

Clarence Landcare Inc. formed in 1995 and is made up of member Landcare groups* (and their members) and individual Clarence Landcare members. The organisation is managed by a volunteer management committee which is elected each year at the Annual General Meeting to represent all members. Staff are employed on a project/program basis. Clarence Landcare is a member of the North Coast Regional Landcare Network and Landcare NSW.

Funding for the organisation is mostly on a competitive basis via project grant applications and contract tenders through regional, state and commonwealth government grant rounds and philanthropic trusts.

** Landcare groups encompass Dunecare, Coastcare, Bushcare, Rivercare and any other member groups working on natural resource management (NRM).*

Welcome to our annual report for 2024-2025

As always, I would first like to thank our staff, employees, contractors, and volunteers for all the hard work you do. Your continued commitment helps us all achieve successful project outcomes and puts us in a strong position for future funding opportunities.

We have finished 10 different projects over the last 12 months and we have another 11 projects rolling over into the next financial year, with 21 active projects in total.

In July Deanna commenced the Landcare coordinator role. We had a WHS review from Peninsula and we were highly commended for our level of WHS compliance.

Clarence Landcare has been involved in a number of workshops again. These include a cultural burn workshop, with a cool burn demonstration at St Joseph's Primary School. A seed collection workshop and a community Koala workshop.

We held staff reviews in October, as well as a first draft of our strategic plan, and we also identified the need for a business plan.

Tim Watson resigned as secretary at our annual AGM. Thanks again Tim for all your help in that role. Ella took up the position of secretary.

Our new website went live in November, as well as the *Black Summer Tractors, Tools and Motorbikes* book being printed.

Clarence Landcare produced a black summer sprinkler system video, which was posted in December. Since then, the video has had over 2200 views, including an email from someone in Los Angeles thanking us for having the bushfire video online. There was also an official launch of the *Tractors, Tools and Motorbikes* book at the Nymboida twilight markets.

We had our BIG 30-year anniversary in May, which was well attended by past and present Landcare members and volunteers. We also held the Jim Knight award presentation at the same time. Sadly, 2 of our previous winners passed away in the lead-up to our annual presentation. Lee Scarlett from Maclean Landcare nursery in February and Kay Jeffery from Iluka Landcare Group in March.

Congratulations to Wayne Stevens and Matt Clarke on being the recipients of this year's 'Jim Knight Memorial Landcare Award' for their work on Susan Island.

I would like to give a big shout-out and welcome our 104 new individual members who have joined Clarence Landcare over the last 12 months.

I would once again like to express my gratitude to the committee for their time, knowledge and commitment to our meetings. We are continuing to practice good governance and keep up to date with the ever-changing regulations and responsibilities.

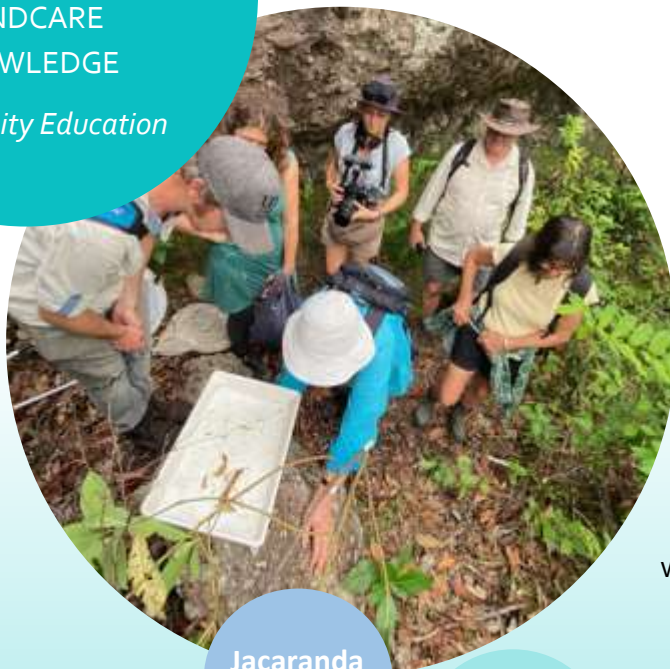

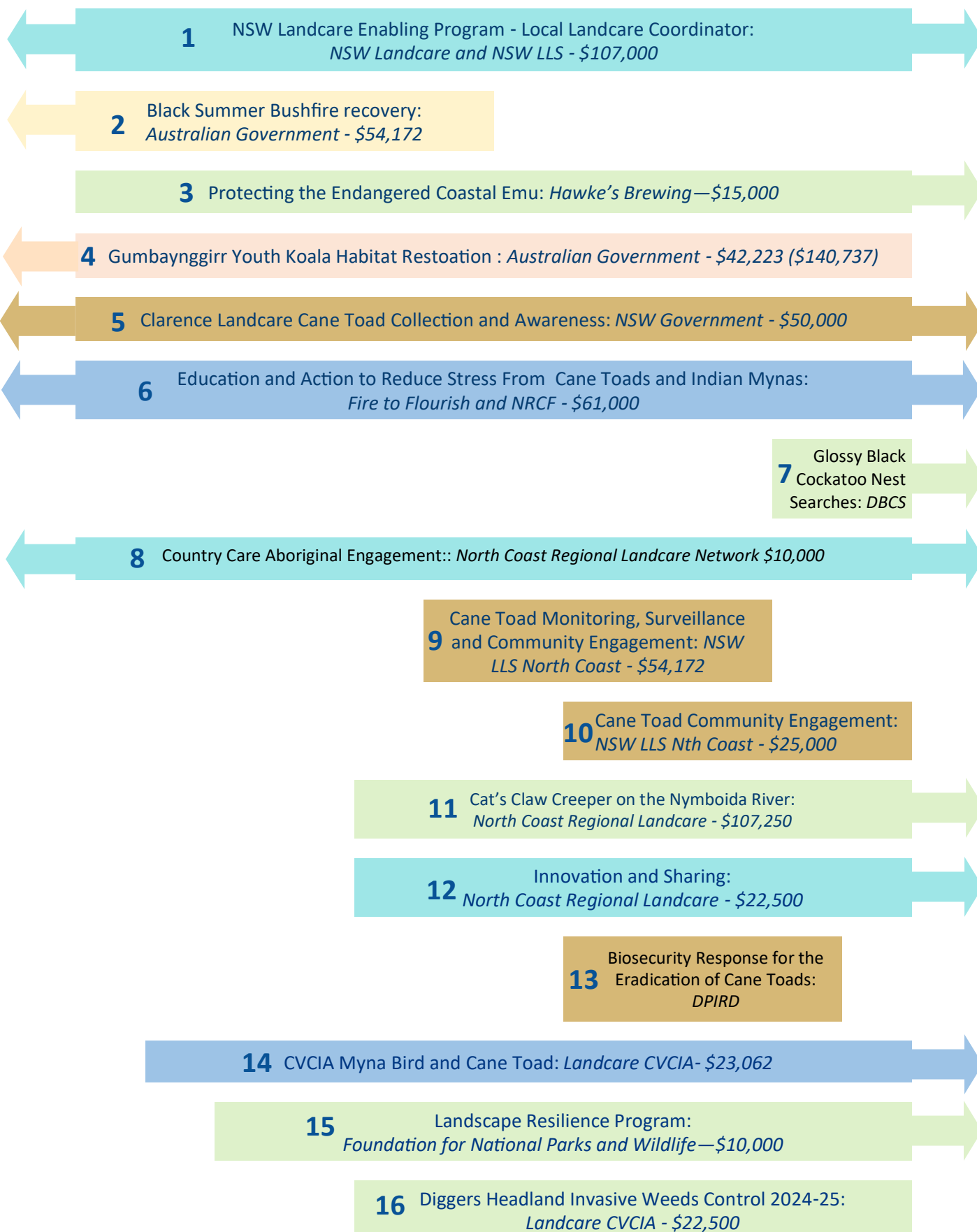
